This list is updated on Thursday of each week and as always, it could change at any time depending on the supply and demand. --A couple of local businessmen have recently purchased truck loads of food from Second Harvest and unloaded them at OST for their church. If your church would like to purchase a load, feel free to call Bob Smith and discuss this with him. He has stated if he could get 8 churches to commit \$100 per month, he would get a load of food from Second Harvest that would go directly to their churches. --Because of these particular truck loads of food coming in, there has been some confusion about “being left out”. Please know that products coming through OST are put in the “horseshoe” and given out to the members who have expressed a need for such products on their contract. Churches who have paid for the loads will continue to receive what they have paid for to be delivered from 2 nd Harvest. OST is happy to be able to unload for them. --We can be very thankful that <u>230 truckloads</u> of goods have been delivered to OST in Oneida THIS YEAR. 4 warehouse locations of Operation Sharing serve 2,000 organizations -Products at OST will be distributed through August 26 th and sign-up begins in September.
