Of that number 468 children needed dental care. In following up on those children, 247 have been confirmed as having seen their dentist. We are working with 29--or they have indicated they do not want help. We were unable to contact 192 parents and letters were sent to them. In the BMI screenings, the overweight/obese category has increased by 1% to 45%. Efforts are being made by the school systems, through educational sessions from the UT Extension Office and Coordinated School Health programs, to get students more involved in daily activities, exercise, nutrition, and healthy eating choices.</p>

<p>Imagination Library</p>	<p><b>Imagination Library</b></p>	<p>--Since the 2010 census shows a 5% increase in Scott County's population—it also shows an increase in our kids. We are at 94% enrollment of kids ages birth to age 5 in the Imagination Library--still the highest! The next highest in TN is McMinn County at 89% vs the state at 56% overall. For April 2011 we had 22 kids graduate and 37 new kids enroll for a present total of 1,388 vs state 211,194 in the program. The cumulative totals are: Scott County total enrolled 105,480 vs state 12,455,336. Graduated 1,759 vs state 217,677.</p>
