The dentists have been contacted and preparations for this year's screenings have begun. August and September promise to be very busy months for CHAMP. In the fall of 2008, there were 2927 students enrolled in all schools in Scott County. Out of that number, 2601 students were screened, with 60 students needing immediate dental care and 422 showing obvious cavities. Follow-ups were made to determine whether they had been able to see their dentist since the screenings. Assistance was offered where needed. The purpose of CHAMP is to work closely with the Student Health Coordinators and the Parents to insure our children's dental needs are being met.
