We have overseen or assisted with the Kettle Fund each Christmas, and except for the last 2 years have overseen and raised the funds necessary to send up to 35 kids to summer camp. We have written grants that have been funded and have provided scholarship funds to students at TN Tech. <i>There has been no compensation to ALQI at any level for any purpose during this time.</i> Volunteers are compensated by the smiles and hugs we get while helping others.
