Remote Area Medical Clinic RAM 423-569-2677 	<p>--The Remote Area Medical Clinic will be coming to Scott County on January 22-23, 2011 at the Boys & Girls Club of Scott County. This will be their sixth visit to Scott County since 2003. The 5 previous clinics saw a total of 3,089 patients for a total estimated value of \$564,208. During the last clinic in 2008, there were 911 patients and 202 volunteers. --Now, during our upcoming clinic, we need YOUR volunteer help and YOUR financial help. There is a place for everyone! Volunteers must be 18 years or older. (15-16 years must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times. Ages 16-18 must have a parent/guardian on site.) Included in this clinic is FREE dental extractions and fillings with 50 dental chairs set up; FREE eye exams and glasses; FREE mammograms; FREE flu shots; and FREE general medical exams.
