For the past 4 years in a row, they have received and distributed over a million dollars of in-kind products each year. This past year the total was \$108,552,141. It took 887 truck loads to move those products. The 25 year total for Operation Sharing comes to \$1,162,989,243.64. Yes, that is over \$1 billion. --Our thanks again to the H. T. Hackney Company for the use of the facility; to the local and area banks for help with the budget funds; to the Scott County Jail trustees for their help; donated food; and the many volunteers that make this venture possible. --Operation Sharing TN is looking for a good sized chest freezer to use in-house. When frozen food is donated, we have no way of storing it to use to feed our volunteers. --There is never any charge for the products we give out; however, we must raise all the funds for our Tennessee budget. We pay 4 part-time salaries, feed 15-20 volunteers, utility bills, taxes, insurance, and other business associated expenses.
